

FRANCO BUFFONI lives in Rome. He is professor of literary criticism and comparative literature. His books of poetry include *Suora Carmelitana* (Premio Montale, Guanda, 1997); *Songs of Spring* (Premio Mondello, Marcos y Marcos, 1999); *Il Profilo del Rosa* (Premio Betocchi, Mondadori, 2000); *Theios* (Interlinea, 2001); *The Shadow of Mount Rosa* (Gradiva Publications, 2002); *Guerra* (Premio Dedalus, Premio Pasolini, Mondadori, 2005). As a translator, he has edited *I Poeti Romantici Inglesi* (Premio Marazza, Mondadori, 2005).

As a journalist, he collaborates with several newspapers and radio programs, and he is the editor of the review *Testo a fronte*, dedicated to the theory and the practice of literary criticism.
